Principal's Message:


Happy Easter! Alleluia!

School council elections are coming up!

This spring, our school community will decide who will help shape and direct local education for the next two years. We encourage parents and community members to consider this opportunity to contribute their ideas, insights, and perspectives in decisions that directly impact the school. Having broad representation from the community is important. Our school needs a variety of voices speaking and ears listening at the table – all sharing a common interest in student learning and education.

Become a candidate:

Pick up a copy of the nomination package from the office or download it from ElectionsYukon.ca. To submit your nomination, reach out to the returning officer for our school. The deadline for submitting your papers is **noon on Thursday, April 25.**

Nomination forms should not be returned to the school office – we cannot accept them.

Eligibility to be a candidate or vote:

To be a candidate, you must be a Canadian citizen, at least 18 years old, and either:

- Be the parent or guardian of a student attending Holy Family Elementary School AND/OR
- Have lived in the attendance area for at least three months and be a registered member of Sacred Heart Cathedral or Our Lady of Victory parish, OR
- Contact the office of the Bishop of the Diocese of Whitehorse to discuss your interest in Catholic education.



Teacher on Call

Teachers on call are also known as substitute teachers and provide important relief when educators in a school need to take time away.

You may be responsible for:

- supervision and oversight of a classroom in a rural, elementary or secondary school; or
- filling in for a classroom teacher, educational assistant or Yukon First Nations Language Teacher who is absent for a short period of time.

You'll receive:

- between \$164 and \$264 per day, depending on your level and type of education;
- acting (increased) pay if the assignment is longer than 5 consecutive days as per the Yukon Association of Education Professionals collective agreement; and
- the ability to set your own flexible schedule.

You can expect:

- to be treated as a professional, working as part of the educational team in the school;
- to have a lesson plan to rely on or to receive direction from the administrators' office; and
- to receive orientation to the building, routines of the school and emergency procedures.



Eligibility

To be eligible for a teacher-on-call position, you must be legally eligible to work in Canada. To be eligible, you must:

- · be a Canadian citizen:
- · be a permanent resident; or
- · have a work permit.

A teaching certificate and licence number are **not** required.

Conditions of employment

The Yukon government requires a security clearance with a RCMP vulnerable sector check prior to starting work.

How it works

There are a few steps in the process to work in Whitehorse-based schools:

- Create an e-recruitment profile and view available roles by selecting the "Yukon Education Recruitment" button at Yukon.ca/iobs
- 2. Follow the on-screen instructions to submit your application.
- Start responding to jobs shared with you using EasyConnect.
